


CONSTRUCTION TIP SHEET 15

Bathrooms -- Type A Unit

2012 Codes

In Groups R-1, R-2, and R-4: When buildings have 4 or more dwelling or sleeping units intended to be occupied as residences, each of these units must be a Type B Unit. A minimum number and/or percentage of these units will be Type A Units per 2012 International Building Code (IBC) 1107.6.



Type A Unit Floor Plan


GENERAL INFORMATION:

- Cabinets and shelving can be installed underneath counter space or lavatories provided that it can be removed without removal or replacement of the lavatory, the floor finish extends under such cabinetry, and the walls behind and surrounding the cabinetry are finished.
- Thresholds, if provided, are 1/2" high, maximum.
- Grab bars: 1-1/4" to 2" in diameter, or the shape provides an equivalent gripping surface and is capable of supporting 250 lbs.
- For code requirements refer to:
 - 1. Chapter 11 of the 2012 IBC
 - 2. Appendix Chapter E, Sections E101 E107
 - 3. ICC / ANSI A117.1 2009




Bathrooms -- Type A Unit














South Wall Interior Elevation (Bathtub Head end wall)






